Adult Leadership Opportunity

The 2013 National Scout Jamboree has been announced and the **Northwest Suburban Council** has started planning for this fantastic event. The Jamboree Committee has been formed and the Committee is seeking adult leaders for the Jamboree Troops. This will be the first time that the Jamboree will be held at the new National BSA Summit Bechtel Reserve in West Virginia! The Summit Bechtel Reserve will now be the permanent home for the National Jamboree.

Northwest Suburban Council will be sending **THREE** Troops and **ONE** Venture Crew to the National Jamboree in 2013. Each troop will need a Scoutmaster and three Assistant Scoutmasters. There are opportunities for 12 adults to serve as Scoutmasters and Assistant Scoutmasters. In addition, there are opportunities for 4 young adults (18 to 21) to serve as Assistant Scoutmasters.

Adults interested in going to the 2013 National Jamboree as a Scoutmaster or an Assistant Scoutmaster must be registered leaders and currently active with a NWSC Troop or Venture Crew. In addition, there will be fitness requirements for the adult leaders due to the challenging physical nature of the Summit Bechtel Reserve.

Trip information

Our troops will stop at the Wright-Patterson Air Force Museum in Ohio for some sightseeing and then will travel to the Summit Bechtel Reserve for the 10 day scouting event of a lifetime. 43,000 Scouts and leaders from around the nation and the world, along with 7,500 staff members, are expected to attend this fun-filled event. Besides the Jamboree arena shows, there are rappelling towers, trap shooting, a Merit Badge Midway and an American Indian village. Included in daily activities are archery, pioneering activities, buckskin games, scuba, kayak, whitewater rafting and boating fun, a racing shell run and raft encounters. A river-rafting trip is planned on our return trip. We will leave from the Service Center on July 12th and return on July 26th, 2013.
